The goal of this two-day event is to provide an academic platform that brings together doctoral students, faculty researchers, and experts from various fields of the human and social sciences.

The organization of this scientific event is based on the following principles:

1. Enhancing scientific research:

The Doctoral Days represent a valuable opportunity to promote the culture of scientific research and advance academic studies, as they allow doctoral students to present their research projects and discuss them with fellow students as well as with research professors.

2. Building a research network between doctoral students and researchers:

This event enables the creation of professional and academic connections between doctoral students and research professors, enhancing collaboration between various research teams and laboratories. It also provides an opportunity for students to learn about research projects similar to or complementary to their own, thereby promoting and fostering interdisciplinarity.

3. Presenting diverse research topics:

Given that Faculties of Letters and Humanities encompass a wide range of scientific laboratories covering several fields, such as linguistics, history, geography, literature, human and social sciences, these days offer a unique opportunity to discuss various issues and research trends across multiple disciplines. This diversity of topics enhances students' understanding of the multiplicity of knowledge fields and the potential for establishing links between them.

4. Strengthening presentation and discussion skills:

Presenting research to an academic audience offers doctoral students an opportunity to strengthen their presentation and delivery skills, in addition to developing their ability

to engage in critical discussions and benefit from the constructive feedback that may be provided during the sessions.

5. Highlighting the importance of applied research:

The Doctoral Days focus on research that provides practical solutions or field studies for societal problems. This aspect provides an opportunity to link academic research with social and economic realities and to contribute, through scientific research, to societal issues.

6. Fostering academic excellence

The Doctoral Days contribute to motivating students to excel and innovate in their research by learning from the experiences of others and exchanging ideas and insights with experienced researchers.

Research Axes

The research axes address vital and contemporary issues designed to stimulate scientific debate and deepen research on topics that combine theory and practice. They also aim to explore the challenges facing modern societies and offer new insights and perspectives on how to address them.
